



Apollinaire Theatre Company & The Chelsea Theatre Works

ORGANIZATION MISSION:

Apollinaire Theatre creates unique encounters with plays that inspire and entertain. Our programs -Teatro Chelsea, Apollinaire Play Lab, Apollinaire in the Park, Resident Artist Program- complement our production season and cultivate an ecosystem of artists of all ages and career stages in our home for adventurous art, the Chelsea Theatre Works.

ORGANIZATION HISTORY:

Apollinaire Theatre Company (ATC) is Chelsea's professional theatre. ATC plays an important role in both our community of Chelsea and in the Boston area theatre community. We are Chelsea's largest arts and culture institution and work to advance equity and inclusion in the arts and to shine a positive spotlight on Chelsea. We are known for artistic excellence and for bringing big and bold ideas to life!

The company was formed in 1995 and named TheatreZone for the location in Boston where we produced our plays: the intersection of the Theatre District and the Combat Zone. Soon after, we began searching Chelsea for a place to create a new performing arts center. In 1999 we purchased the historic Post Office/Odd Fellows Hall in Chelsea to create the Chelsea Theatre Works, which now houses three theaters:

OUR THEATRE

We are known for adventurous contemporary plays, regional premieres, and for breathing new life into classics.

OUR PROGRAMS:

Teatro Chelsea—celebrates Latin cultures, showcases and fosters local talent, builds community in Chelsea through arts engagement and collaboration, and is establishing a hub for Latin artists in the Boston area.

Apollinaire Play Lab (APL)—empowers children and supports their development with quality, theater, dance, and art classes as well as production opportunities.

Apollinaire in the Park—brings environmentally staged bilingual works of theater to audiences for FREE outside every summer!

The **Resident Artist Program**—supports performing artists with free space to develop and produce, and opportunities to collaborate and share resources and knowledge.

We are proud recipients of multiple Elliot Norton and IRNE Awards, including The Kenneth A. MacDonald Award for Theatre Excellence awarded to Artistic Director Danielle Fauteux Jacques. We are also honored to have received the New England Theatre Conference Regional Award for Outstanding Achievement in the American Theatre.

AESCHYLUS (c. 525 - c. 456 BCE) (Playwright) was one of the great writers of Greek Tragedy in 5th century BCE Classical Athens. Known as 'the father of tragedy', the playwright wrote up to 90 plays, winning with half of them at the great Athenian festivals of Greek drama. According to Aristotle, he expanded the number of characters in the theatre and allowed conflict among them. Formerly, characters interacted only with the chorus. Only seven tragedies attributed to him have survived intact: The Persians, Seven Against Thebes, The Suppliants, the trilogy known as The Oresteia (the three tragedies Agamemnon, The Libation Bearers and The Eumenides), and Prometheus Bound (whose authorship is disputed). With the exception of this last play - the success of which is uncertain - all of Aeschylus's extant tragedies are known to have won first prize at the City Dionysia.. He was likely the first dramatist to present plays as a trilogy. His Oresteia is the only extant ancient example. At least one of his plays was influenced by the Persians' second invasion of Greece (480-479 BC). This work, The Persians, is one of very few classical Greek tragedies concerned with contemporary events, and the only one extant.

ABBIE ANDERSON (Women's Chorus) is an actor, singer, dancer, educator and writer based in Boston. She recently graduated from Emerson College with her BFA in Theatre and Performance. Some past credits include Valerie in Bonnets, Moana-Eats in Rage, Ms. Fleming in Heathers, Chuck in Hot Dam!, and the Nurse in Romeo and Juliet. Professionally, she has toured with The Rev Theatre Company doing Theatre for Young Audiences, and has performed at Radio City Music Hall, Sony Hall, and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. 
